Field Trips - A Bounty of Learning

Nursery children visited the Carry Fresh supermarket in Frazer Town. It provided a valuable hands-on learning experience, helping children identify fruits, vegetables and everyday items.

Lower and Upper Kindergarten students had an exciting, educational visit to the fire station on 3rd February. They enjoyed watching the amazing water display and were fascinated by the robot that is used when firefighters cannot enter a burning building safely. It was a wonderful hands-on experience that helped them understand fire safety while having lots of fun!

Students of Grade I visited the fire station near M. G. Road. They observed fire-fighting equipment and learnt how firefighters respond to emergencies. They also understood different types of fire and safety methods to extinguish them.

Students of Grade II visited the GPO, which was an enriching learning experience. Students explored the Philately Department, learnt about the Aadhaar process and observed how letters are collected, sorted, and delivered. They also discovered other postal services and enjoyed posting letters to their parents.

Students of Grade III visited Bangalore Traffic Park, where they learnt about traffic rules and road safety. They understood traffic signs, signals, and the importance of helmets, seat belts, and pedestrian crossings. Practical demonstrations helped them learn how drivers and pedestrians should behave on the road.

Students of Grade IV visited Swachagraha Kalika Kendra, where they learnt the importance of cleanliness and caring for the environment. They understood waste segregation, recycling, and composting using kitchen waste. The visit encouraged them to reduce plastic use, save water and maintain clean surroundings.



Students of Grade V had an enriching educational field trip to the High Court of Karnataka where they explored the museum showcasing antique artefacts from the British period and visited the grand library housing innumerable books. The students also observed lawyers referring to legal texts, gaining valuable insight into the judicial system and its heritage.

Students of Grade VI visited the Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum, Bangalore. They explored various exhibits, observed scientific models and learnt through interactive experiences. The trip connected classroom learning with real-life applications.

Students of Grade VII went to the Regional Design and Technical Research Centre. They observed pottery making and even tried working with clay. They saw handmade sculptures, detailed embroidery, and traditional Mysore paintings. A fun stamping activity allowed them to create and take home their own designs.

Students of Grade VIII visited the Traffic Control Room on Infantry Road. They explored the museum and learnt about the history of traffic policing, traffic signals and road safety. They also observed modern traffic monitoring systems and gained awareness of the important role of traffic police.

Students of Grade IX visited the NIMHANS Brain Museum. They explored real human organs and learnt about the structure and functions of the brain through an interactive session. They also observed cross-sections of injured brains, gaining insight into the effects of trauma and disease. The visit was highly informative and sparked scientific curiosity.
